Geese in the Middle

Cutting Instructions

Bag - (2) $2^{5}/8'' \times 17^{1}/2''$, (2) $1^{3}/8'' \times 17^{1}/2''$,

(1) $4^{1}/2^{n} \times 13^{1}/2^{n}$, (4) $7^{1}/8^{n} \times 8^{n}$,

(1) $1^{1}/4^{n}$ strip for binding, (8) handle tabs using template provided.


Contrast - $(4)^{7/8}$ " × $17^{1/2}$ "

Make (2) copies of flying geese foundation and foundation piece. Sew $7^{1}/8" \times 8"$ to each side of geese (Diagram 1). Repeat for total (2). Sew contrast band to top and bottom Diagram 2). Repeat for total (2). Sew $2^{5}/8" \times 17^{1}/2"$ to top and $1^{3}/8 \times 17^{1}/2"$ to bottom (Diagram 3). Repeat for total (2). Sew bag units together with $4^{1}/2" \times 13^{1}/2"$ bottom print between (Diagram 4).

Layer bag front with batting and back and quilt. Trim back and batting edges even with bag. Zig zag or serge edges.

Fold bag in half right sides together and stitch side seams (Diagram 5). Refold and stitch bottom to sides (Diagram 6).

Bind top edge. With right sides together sew handle tabs together leaving an opening to turn. Turn, press, and stitch opening shut. Repeat for total (4) finished tabs. Use tabs to attach handles to bag. Stitch a button to each tab (Diagram 7).


